

FY2021 2nd Quarter Report on Local Law 249-2017

JANUARY 2021



Introduction

Local Law 249 was passed by the New York City Council on November 16, 2017 and took effect July 1, 2018. The law requires the Department of Finance (DOF) to notify property owners when real estate instruments are recorded on their properties.

The law mandates that DOF provide a quarterly report to the council and publish the report on the department's website. The report must include:

- 1) Total number of individuals registered to receive notification, disaggregated by the type of interested party
- 2) Total number of individuals registered to receive notification for multiple properties
- 3) Total number of properties for which an individual is registered to receive notifications
- 4) Total number of individuals who opted out of receiving notifications
- 5) Total number of individuals who contacted the department regarding an incorrect or suspected fraudulent document recording, grouped by the source of information that led to contacting the agency
- 6) Total number of referrals made by the New York City Register or Richmond County Clerk related to suspected fraudulent document recording, the outcome of the referrals, and information about investigations conducted by the Sheriff's Office.

Findings

This is the Department of Finance's report on Local Law 249. It contains data through December 31, 2020.
